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




- It harbors key diagnostic elements which can not be replaced by microscopic examination.


Teaching Points: Think and Understand

 - Observe and understand.


Critical Thinking






LAMNs and Mucin: "Hack" 1. Ink




LAMNs and Mucin: "Hack" 2. Spray with Acid








Lymph Node Submission Modality Considerations

- If absolute number and/or % of positive lymph nodes is important then ______.


Mono-color Jigsaw:



Mono-color Jigsaw: Serial Section Book Style




